

## How to Read this Table

Attached is the list of the hundreds of job openings in Washington and Oregon for the Forest Service next summer. This document is meant to help you understand the information within the table and then find the job on USAJobs.gov. It lists the position name, pay scale, duty location and announcement number for each job. For a general list of the jobs offered, visit [www.fs.usda.gov/main/r6/jobs](http://www.fs.usda.gov/main/r6/jobs). To apply to the jobs, you must go to [USAJobs.gov](http://USAJobs.gov).

- 0462: This is the 'Standard Occupational Code' that reflects the general job. This one stands for Forestry Technician, which covers many jobs in Recreation, Timber and Fire.
- 03: This denotes the pay scale. Typically, the same job might be offered at a few different pay levels. The amount of experience and education you have related to a job determines for which GS level you qualify. OPM.gov lists all the GS levels and their corresponding salaries. It is also listed on USAJobs.gov.

This is the general name of the job, with more detail in the parentheses. It is probably the easiest way to look for the various jobs you may be interested in. Some similar jobs have slightly different names, so don't stop looking after you find one. If you aren't sure of a listing, go to USAJobs.gov and search that title. It will give you a general description of the work. Make sure you are searching only within the agency: USDA Forest Service.

This is the location of the office where you will first report to work. You can search the table for locations of interest.

This is the Announcement number. There are many ways to search jobs in USAJobs.gov but with this code, you can hone in on this one job. Remember, there may be multiple locations listed.
