

**OCCUPANCY AND USE RESTRICTIONS**  
**NATIONAL FOREST AREAS AND NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM TRAILS AND ROADS**  
**DESCHUTES NATIONAL FOREST**  
**BEND FORT ROCK RANGER DISTRICT**

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551, 36 CFR § 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on areas and designated sections of National Forest System trails and roads in the West Bend Project Closure Area described below and as depicted on the attached map (Attachment A):

- 1. Going into or being upon any of the lands within the West Bend Project Closure Area, including all National Forest System roads and trails therein, as described below and shown on the attached map. 36 CFR § 261.53(e)**
- 2. Being on National Forest System roads. 36 CFR § 261.54(e)**
- 3. Being on National Forest System trails. 36 CFR § 261.55(a)**

**WEST BEND PROJECT CLOSURE AREA**

Beginning at on Forest Road (FR) FR-46 Cascades Lakes Highway at the intersection with FR-4604-400, then south and west along FR-46 to the junction with Storm King Trail, then north on Storm King Trail until the intersection with FR-4615, then east on FR-4615 to the intersection with FR 4610, then north and west on FR-4610 to the intersection with VooDoo Trail, then west and north on VooDoo Trail to the intersection with Elfin Magic Trail, then south east along Elfin Magic Trail to the intersection of FR-4604-400, south east along FR-4604-400 to its terminus at FR-46. Forest Roads behind the gates located on FR-4604-000 at Phil's trailhead, on FR-4600-400 at the intersection with FR-46, and on FR4604 at the intersection with FR-4610 are closed to motorized vehicle traffic. All as shown on the attached map, within the Deschutes National Forest, hereby incorporated into this order as Attachment 'A'.

These restrictions are in addition to those prohibitions enumerated in Subpart A of 36 CFR § 261 and any other special restrictions pertaining to the described lands.

## **EXEMPTIONS**

**Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following are exempt from this order:**

1. Personnel with written authorization by a Forest Officer, which specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act or omission. The issuing Officer may include such conditions as are considered necessary for the protection of the area, or for the promotion of the health, safety, or welfare of its users.
2. Any Federal, State, or local Officer, contractor or volunteer in the performance of an official duty.
3. The described West Bend Project closure area, including Forest Service roads and trails therein, will be open for public entry and use between 1700 (5:00 PM) every Friday afternoon, until 0400 (4:00 AM) every Monday morning for the duration of the closure order.
4. The described West Bend Project closure area, including Forest Service roads and trails therein, will be open for public entry and use on the following Holidays from 0001 hours to 2359 hours: May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (Memorial Day); July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (Independence Day); September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (Labor Day); November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (Veterans's Day); November 24, 2016 (Thanksgiving Day).

This closure is enacted for the protection of public and employee safety.

**This order supersedes order # 06-01-01-15-002-1 which is hereby rescinded. This order becomes effective at 0400 am, May 16, 2016, and will remain in effect for two years or until rescinded.**
