EXPLANATION OF LEGEND ITEMS

Snowmobile Trail:
Routes managed for snowmobiles, with occasional grooming. These routes are managed for snowmobiling from 12/1 thru 4/15. These trails are marked with orange diamonds.

Snowmobile Trail:
Routes managed for snowmobiles, with occasional grooming. These routes are managed for snowmobiling from 12/1 thru 4/30. These trails are marked with orange diamonds.

Snowmobile Allowed Route in Closure Areas:
These routes are managed neither as ski nor snowmobile trails, but are open to snowmobiles (unless otherwise noted), through otherwise closed areas. Motorized vehicles must stay on the designated route.

Snowmobile Prohibited Route in Open Areas:
These routes are prohibited to snowmobile use in otherwise open areas.


Other Route (Snowmobile Use Allowed 12/1 to 3/15)
These routes are managed neither as ski nor snowmobile trails, but are open to snowmobiles (unless otherwise noted), from 12/1 to 3/15. Motorized vehicles must stay on the designated route.

Other Route (Snowmobile Use Allowed 12/1 to 4/1)
These routes are managed neither as ski nor snowmobile trails, but are open to snowmobiles (unless otherwise noted), from 12/1 to 4/1. Motorized vehicles must stay on the designated route.


National Forest lands open to over-snow vehicles (snowmobiles only):
Areas open to over-snow vehicles within the Lolo National Forest are limited to snowmobiles only. A snowmobile is defined as a motorized vehicle capable of use over snow or ice, which is driven by a combination of cleats, belts, tracks, and skis.

National Forest lands where over-snow vehicles are prohibited year long:
Areas prohibited year long to over-snow vehicles within the Lolo National Forest.

National Forest lands where over-snow vehicles are restricted seasonally:
These areas are where snowmobiles are prohibited seasonally between October 15 and December 1 on the Lolo National Forest. A snowmobile is defined as a motorized vehicle capable of use over snow or ice, which is driven by a combination of cleats, belts, tracks, and skis.

Lolo Pass Winter Sports Area:

This is a fee use area of shared winter recreation and is sponsored in part through the cooperative efforts of the Missoula Snowgoers, Forest Service, and Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks. Parking area congestion and diversified trail use requires that all recreational activities be respected and that users exercise tolerance and good safety practices to reduce conflict. In order to continue the high quality winter recreational opportunities in the Missoula area, all users need to recreate together in a courteous manner that will lead to common ground and broad-based support.

Please be respectful of all users:

- When encountering other users on the trail, please move to the right.
- Yield to faster skiers and snowmobilers and those coming downhill.
- Snowmobiles are not allowed on groomed cross-country ski trails.
- Dogs are not allowed on any groomed ski trails.
- Pack it in – Pack it out!
