Dear Prospective Offeror:

The Forest Service will receive Technical and Price Proposals (no public opening) at the Deschutes National Forest Supervisor's Office, 63095 Deschutes Market Road, Bend, OR 97701, no later than 11:00 AM local time on January 12, 2015, for the Sting Stewardship Integrated Resource Timber Contract. This contract is located in Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 23, 24, 25, 26, 33, 34, 35, 36, T.26S., R.7E.; Sections 6, 7, 18, 19, 30, T.26S., R.8E.; W.M., Surveyed Klamath County, Oregon.

Contract Form FS-2400-13 will be used. The termination date for this contract is December 31, 2018.

This stewardship contract includes the removal of timber and the completion of two (2) mandatory restorative service projects and one (1) optional restorative service project meant to improve ecological conditions within the Deschutes National Forest. Contractor will earn stewardship credits equal to the value of service work completed and accepted that will offset an equal amount of stumpage required to be paid by the Contractor.

**Slash disposal and Road Maintenance are required deposits**

The minimum acceptable bid for advertised timber is \$268,265.40 (for biddable species). A bid guarantee is not required. A performance bond is required.

Offeror is required to submit a Bid Price/Best Value proposal for this contract. Contract award will be based on a determination of which proposal constitutes the best value to the Government. Proposals will be submitted in two parts and will include a Technical and a Price Proposal. Details on what to include in the proposals are stated on the Bid Form. Award will be made to the Offeror whose bid is both technically acceptable and whose technical/price relationship is most advantageous to the Government. The Government may, when in its interest, reject any or all proposals or waive any informality in bids received. A written award mailed, or otherwise furnished to the successful Offeror shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

A pre-offer conference will be held for prospective Offerors at 9:00 AM, Thursday December 17, 2015 at the Crescent Ranger District, located at 136471 Hwy 97 N., 97733 in Crescent, OR. The Forest Service will leave tree mark approximately 5 acres in one subdivision to demonstrate the prescription before the pre-offer conference. The purpose of the meeting is to go through the Integrated Resource Timber contract, explain the Best Value award process and requirements for both the price and technical proposals, and explain/review the requirements of the stewardship restoration projects.

Parties submitting a Technical Proposal are to use the Region 6 Technical Proposal Template for the Integrated Resource Timber Contract in responding to included evaluation criteria. Contractors can submit Alternate Technical Proposals for this project. However, the Contractor must submit a Technical Proposal that addresses the evaluation criteria as stated in addition to submitting the alternate proposal.
