500	Lolo Motorway	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>The Lolo Motorway is open. High-clearance, four-wheel-drive vehicles are <u>required</u>. Travelers can expect narrow roadways in places and large rocks embedded in the road surface.</p> <p>Summertime motorists and ATV riders traveling on Road 500 should bring chain saws and be prepared to remove fallen trees from the roadway.</p> <p>Call the Lochsa Ranger Station, (208) 926-4274 for updates.</p>
560	Liz Butte	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>Contact the Lochsa Ranger Station, (208) 926-4274 for updates.</p>
569	Parachute Hill	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>Road 569 is open.</p> <p>Be sure to contact the Powell Ranger Station, (208) 942-3113 for updates.</p>
107	Saddle Camp	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>Saddle Camp Road 107 is open, but sloughs have narrowed the road to a single lane in a few places.</p> <p>Be sure to contact the Powell Ranger Station, (208) 942-3113 for updates.</p>
101	Smith Creek	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>Part of Smith Creek Road 101 is open.</p> <p>Contact the Lochsa Ranger Station, (208) 926-4274 for updates.</p>
100	Lolo Breaks (Kamiah to Musselshell)	OPEN	09/02/16	<p>Road 100 is open from Kamiah to the Musselshell Work Center.</p> <p>Road 100 was closed partially in 2014 due to a severe slump near Lolo Creek Campground. A temporary, single lane bypass has been constructed to allow vehicle passage. Forest Service engineers are working on a more permanent solution prevent future slumps and landslides in this area. <i>Please use caution and slowdown while driving in this area.</i></p>

104	Beaver Saddle to Beaver Dam Saddle	<b>OPEN</b>	09/02/16	The 104 road between Beaver Saddle and Beaver Dam saddle is open.
