Position Title: Recreation Technician

Position Summary: This position is located on the Brownstown Ranger District of the Hoosier National Forest in southern Indiana, located in Bedford, IN. This position will work primarily for the Recreation program on the district, but will also be shared with the Ecosystem program as needed and available. This is a field going position and most of the work will be performed outside under all weather conditions and will involve weekend work April thru October, and possible evening work on Holidays.

General Responsibilities (to include, but not limited to):

1. Primary duties will be to assist in maintaining campground and other recreational facilities. The primary focus of these duties on will be at Hardin Ridge Recreation Area.
2. Assist with operation and maintenance of the sewage treatment plant at Hardin Ridge Recreation Area.
3. Assist in trail maintenance for both wilderness and non-wilderness trail systems. This will include working with the Hoosier NF mule pack string.
4. Assist with visitor contacts, provide information and education.
5. Assist with Hazard Tree identification and removal.

6. Complete and submit all necessary MAI/AmeriCorps paperwork and reports in a timely manner.
7. Wear an MAI uniform and/or appropriate identifiers and required safety gear while performing service or attending official events.

Secondary duties may include the following as opportunities arise:

1. Assist with surveys, monitoring and treatment of Non-Native Invasive Plant Species.
2. Assist with wildlife surveys
3. Assist with wildlife habitat improvement projects
4. Assist in timber sale preparation activities
5. Assist with application of prescribed fire
6. Assist with Timber stand improvement projects.

Position Requirements:

1. Must have a valid driver's license, clean driving record and ability to provide documentation. Must comply with Driver Certification and Safety Agreement (see VetsWork Application Documents on website).
2. Attend a mandatory orientation on the Shawnee National Forest (February 22 to February 26, 2016), quarterly Intern trainings (food and lodging provided for orientation and trainings), and monthly Intern meetings.
3. Ability to perform arduous work in all types of weather hiking across rough terrain carrying packs and equipment.
4. Must be willing to work with pack animals.
5. Regular and reliable attendance.
6. Ability to secure suitable outdoor clothing, rain jackets and pants, work boots, etc. Please contact unit for more specific information before purchasing any items.
7. Intern will normally work 40 hours per week; there will be some flexibility in work schedule with possible evening or weekend work on occasion.
8. Must have served in US Armed Forces and have a DD214 with an honorable discharge.
9. U.S. citizen, national or lawful permanent resident.
10. Possession of a high school diploma or equivalent, or commit to earning one prior to receiving an education award.
11. Ability to commit to the full term of service for which they are applying.
12. Selection, placement and retention are contingent upon passing the National Sex Offender Public Register and a national FBI fingerprint check. Position does not have recurring access to vulnerable populations. This position does not include recurring access to vulnerable populations including children ages 17 and under, persons aged 60 and older and/or individuals with disabilities.
13. Members are eligible to serve up to four terms of service and receive AmeriCorps Education awards for each term of service up to the value of two full time education awards only. It is the responsibility of the applicant to inform MAI of any previous service in an AmeriCorps program, regardless of whether or not they completed the previous term(s) of service. MAI is not liable for providing an Education Award to a member if they are not eligible under the Corporation for National and Community Service AmeriCorps guidelines.

Preferred Qualifications

1. Experience with stock – Mules.
2. Chainsaw certified.
3. Experience with wastewater treatment plants.
4. Experience with trail and campground maintenance.
5. Basic knowledge of hand tools and small machinery (mowers, etc).

Member Benefits Include:

1. A total taxable living allowance (before taxes) of \$12,530.
2. Upon successful completion of a term of service, eligible members/leaders receive an education award of \$5,730. The education award can be used to repay qualified student loans, for further education in an accredited institution of higher learning, vocational or trade schools. The education award is taxed in the year that it is used.
3. Loan forbearance (after successful completion of a term of service, AmeriCorps will pay the accrued interest on qualified loans, which is taxable).
4. Basic medical insurance (covers members only, not dependents; vision and dental not included).
5. Child care allowance for those who qualify.
6. We can assist the member in finding low cost housing.

Transportation Information:

1. Personal vehicle is recommended to get to service site.
2. Organizational vehicle is available for service activities.

3. To apply to this specific position, click "Search Listings" under the "My AmeriCorps" menu and search by program name **Mt. Adams Institute** (this needs to be spelled exactly as listed).
4. Select the position listing: **Mt. Adams Institute – VetsWork – VETERANS ONLY** and click "Apply Now" at the bottom of the page.

Step 2: Submit these additional materials promptly (email preferred except for Certification Form). **Your application will not be considered until all of the materials listed below are received.**

1. A resume and a cover letter for each position in which you are interested. If you have already emailed these documents, please bring that to my attention after you submit your application.
2. A copy of your DD 214 with an honorable discharge
3. Visit <http://mtadamsinstitute.com/jobs/>, print the Certification Form, sign and date the form, and mail to the address below. This document must be **mailed** to our office with your original signature.
4. A copy of your driving record/abstract from your local DMV. Your abstract must go back at least three years, which may mean you need to submit additional abstracts for other states you have been a resident of within that timeframe.
