About the Center

The Central Idaho Dispatch Center's primary purpose is to support fire management activities for the Salmon-Challis National Forest and a portion of the Idaho Falls BLM District Office. Cooperators include local fire departments, Idaho Fish and Game, and several county sheriffs' offices. The center supports over 400 incidents with a 20 year average of 100 wildfires and several Incident Management Teams annually. The duties are challenging and rewarding.

About the Position

The primary purpose of this position is to perform a wide range of logistical and administrative duties in support of wildland fire including but not limited to: transcribe and maintain telephone and radio transmissions; process resource orders; support intelligence services; and maintain electronic data utilizing various programs including ROSS, WIMS, and Wildcad.

Work schedule will include nights, weekends, overtime, and irregular hours in a fast paced office setting. Expected duration of employment is June through September of 2016, depending on activity.

The Salmon-Challis National Forest covers over 4.3 million acres in east-central Idaho. There are currently six administrative units on the Forest: Salmon-Cobalt, North Fork and Leadore Ranger Districts in the North Zone and the Challis/Yankee Fork, Lost River, Middle Fork Ranger Districts in the South Zone.

The Forest contains over 1.3 million acres of the Frank Church--River of No Return Wilderness, Wild & Scenic Salmon River and the Middle Fork of the Salmon River as well as Mt. Borah, Idaho's tallest peak. This country offers adventure, solitude, and breathtaking scenery. The area is a highly desired destination for hunting, fishing, white-water rafting and many other popular recreational pursuits. The Forest features diverse, rough topography, geologic conditions, and miles of streams with anadromous fish spawning habitat creating a highly complex land management situation.

Idaho Falls BLM District is composed 3.7 million acres and four field offices: Challis (799,000 acres); Pocatello (557,000 acres); Salmon (493,000 acres) and the Upper Snake (1,854,000 acres). Primary uses on the district include grazing, recreation, mining, fisheries, fire and realty. Approximately one million people recreate on public lands in this district each year. Over 1400 Right of Ways for commercial and private activities are authorized. The District administers subsurface minerals particularly phosphate leasing near Pocatello and molybdenum near Challis.

The Idaho Falls BLM District is a true multiple-use resource district, hosting everything from wilderness areas to phosphate mining to wild horses. The District stretches from the Utah border north to Montana on Idaho's east side.

About Salmon, Idaho

The City: Salmon is the heart of the Salmon River Valley, surrounded by three mountain ranges and situated at the junction of Idaho State Highway 28 and U.S. Highway 93 and at the forks of the Salmon and Lemhi Rivers. The city has a population of about 3300 and is the seat of Lemhi County with a population of 8000. The main industries are ranching, mining and recreation. At 4000 feet elevation, the surrounding terrain varies greatly from rolling, arid hills to steep forested slopes above 10,000 feet.

Climate: Salmon enjoys a dry, warm climate during the summer and fall months with daily highs averaging between 75 and 95 degrees, and nightly lows from 45 to 60 degrees. The climate in the winter is ideal for snow sports, with high temperatures typically in the 20s and lower 30s and low temperatures averaging from 14 to 25 degrees with occasional sub-zero readings.

Shopping and Services: Salmon is a self-contained community with a full variety of shopping, business, medical, and professional services. In addition to basic services there are a variety of specialty shops and an art gallery. Salmon also has nursing and residential care facilities, hospice, and a spectrum of social services. The public library offers computer and other services.

Medical: The City of Salmon has a new community hospital affiliated with a major hospital in Missoula, Montana and provides Life-Flight, Search and Rescue units, physicians, dentists, optometrists, and specialist affiliations with Western Montana Medical Clinic.

Schools: A variety of pre-schools and day care centers are available. In addition the elementary, junior and senior high schools offer numerous extra-curricular activities and sports.

Housing: Typical housing prices in town range from approximately \$150,000 to over \$300,000. Monthly rental for a typical three-bedroom home runs around \$600 - \$800. Several real estate offices are available, some with national affiliations. There are also mobile home parks and two in-city campgrounds.

Entertainment and Activities: A wide array of entertainment is provided by various organizations throughout the year. The Salmon Arts Council provides high quality artistic events for the community presenting a wide range of performers in music, theater, dance, visual art shows and sales, artist workshops, juried art exhibitions, artist-in-education residences and other programs for the local schools. Recreation facilities include a nine-hole golf course, tennis courts, a bowling alley, baseball diamonds, hockey rink and outdoor community swimming pool. The Sacajawea Interpretive and Education Center provides a variety of interpretive and education programs throughout the year focused on the rich history of the area.

Recreation for Salmon and Challis Areas: The Salmon River and the Middle Fork of the Salmon River, federally protected as Wild and Scenic Rivers, are renowned for white-water rafting, kayaking, floating and jet-boating. Outfitter and Guide services are offered and both Salmon and Challis serve as gateways to the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness, encompassing more than 2.4 million acres. The primitive mountain area provides diverse hunting opportunities. Fishing (trout and steelhead) is open virtually all-year. Miles of groomed trails and routes are prepared for cross-country skiing and snowmobiling while downhill skiing, ice fishing and other winter fun can be enjoyed nearby.
