TEMPORARY AREA CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and Title 36 CFR 261.50 (a) the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this order, and depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A, all within the Santa Catalina Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Pima County, Arizona:

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Parking a motorized vehicle between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0 along Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Road. 36 CFR 261.58(g)
2. Discharging a firearm, air rifle, paint ball gun, gas gun or archery equipment between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0 of Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Road, or within 0.6 miles of that segment of the road. 36 CFR 261.58(m)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

AREA DESCRIBED:

The restricted area is the segment of Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Road, between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0. This area is located at T13S, R17E, S 30, 31 Gila and Salt River Meridian (As shown on the attached map).

PURPOSE:


The purpose of the temporary area closure is for the following purposes:

- To allow proper analysis and cleanup of three recreational target shooting areas along Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Road (Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0), without public interference.
- To assure the protection of public health and safety by prohibiting the recreational discharge of firearms.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order shall be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 30, 2016 or until it is rescinded, whichever is earlier.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].
