2016 TEMPORARY POSITIONS FOR PHASE 2

REGION 1 – SERVING NORTH IDAHO, MONTANA, AND THE DAKOTAS



The Northern Region or Region 1 of the U.S. Forest Service will be filling multiple temporary (seasonal) positions for the upcoming 2016 field season. Openings will be available at the GS-2 through GS-9 grade levels and are for positions with a maximum six-month tour of duty (not to exceed 1,039 hours). The starting dates of the positions are anticipated to be between April and early June, 2016.

USDA Nondiscrimination Policy, June 2, 2015
