Dear Interested Citizen:

The 2012 Planning Rule (36 CFR 219) requires the Ochoco National Forest and Crooked River National Grassland to establish land management plan monitoring plans that are consistent with the new Planning Rule's monitoring requirements by May 9, 2016, or as soon as practicable. We have reviewed our existing Ochoco Land and Resource Management Plan (Forest Plan) and Crooked River National Grassland Land and Resource Management Plan (Grassland Plan) monitoring plans and developed modifications to conform to the new monitoring requirements. When finalized, this transition monitoring plan will be in effect until the Forest Plan and Grassland Plan are revised.

We want to take this opportunity to share our draft monitoring plans with you and request your input. Your input would be most helpful to us in finalizing the monitoring plans if we receive it by March 18, 2016.

#### **Background - 2012 Planning Rule**

The 2012 Planning Rule includes eight monitoring requirements where at least one monitoring question and indicator is established for each of the eight requirements and they are as follows:

- i. The status of select watershed conditions.
- ii. The status of select ecological conditions including key characteristics of terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems.
- iii. The status of focal species to assess the ecological conditions required under §219.9.
- iv. The status of a select set of the ecological conditions required under §219.9 to contribute to the recovery of federally listed threatened and endangered species, conserve proposed and candidate species, and maintain a viable population of each species of conservation concern.
- v. The status of visitor use, visitor satisfaction, and progress toward meeting recreation objectives.
- vi. Measureable changes on the plan area related to climate change and other stressors that may be affecting the plan area.
- vii. Progress toward meeting the desired conditions and objectives in the plan, including for providing multiple use opportunities.
- viii. The effects of each management system to determine that they do not substantially and permanently impair the productivity of the land (16 U.S.C. 1604(g)(3)(C)).

The Forest's and Grassland's new monitoring plans must contain one or more monitoring questions and associated indicators to address each of the monitoring requirements. The monitoring questions tie to specific Forest and Grassland Plan components. They focus on providing the information necessary to evaluate whether Plan components are effective and appropriate, and whether management is being effective in maintaining or achieving progress toward the desired conditions and objectives for the Forest and Grassland.



The first Ochoco National Forest and Crooked River National Grassland monitoring reports under the updated monitoring plans are expected to be published in 2018.

### **Draft Monitoring Plan Development**

These draft monitoring plans were developed using an interdisciplinary team, and takes into consideration data already being collected, work force capacity, and funding limitations. The monitoring questions reflect ecological, social and economic factors important to consider for informed management of the resources in the plan areas.

When the Forest and Grassland embark on the Forest/Grassland Plan revision process, the information gathered through the monitoring plans will inform the revision analysis and the monitoring plans themselves will be updated to fit the revised Forest and Grassland Plans. At this time, the Ochoco National Forest and Crooked River National Grassland have not initiated the Land and Resource Management Plan revision process.

### **Administrative Changes**

In order to implement the new monitoring plans, the Forest and Grassland will be making the following change. The draft transition monitoring plans, once finalized, will replace the existing monitoring plans described on Forest Plan pages 5-1 to 5-17 and Grassland Plan pages 5-1 to 5-16. The changes will be made using an administrative change under the 2012 Planning Rule (36 CFR 219). An administrative change (36 CFR 219.13(c)) is any change to a plan that is not a plan amendment or plan revision. Administrative changes include corrections of clerical errors to any part of the plan, conformance of the plan to new statutory or regulatory requirements, or changes to other content in the plan, including the monitoring program (§ 219.7(f)(iii)).

### **Your Comments**

We would appreciate your comments on the specific monitoring questions and indicators and the proposed administrative change to replace the current monitoring plan. Your comments will be utilized to identify deficiencies, changes or other concerns associated with the draft monitoring plan. Once comments have been considered, a final monitoring plan will be developed and released.
