Prohibition of Motor Vehicles on Roads and Trails

Pursuant to 16 United States Code § 551, and 36 Code of Federal Regulations § 261.50 (b), the following acts are prohibited on specific National Forest System Roads (NFSR), and road segments, and the National Forest System Trail (NFST) listed below, and hereinafter referred to as the Restricted Roads and Restricted Trail. The Restricted Roads and Restricted Trail are each within the Pike and San Isabel National Forests, located in Douglas, Lake, Chaffee, Custer, Huerfano and Park Counties, Colorado.

The Restricted Roads and Restricted Trail are further described below, and are depicted on the attached maps, which are hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibits A - I.

This Order is issued according to the terms of a Stipulated Settlement Agreement entered in United States District Court for the District of Colorado.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Using any motor vehicle on a Restricted Road. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54 (a).
2. Using any motor vehicle on a Restricted Trail. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55 (b).

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any federal, state or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of an official duty;
2. Persons with a Forest Service issued permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission;
3. Persons using an over-snow vehicle, as defined below, while in use over snow.

DEFINITION:

As defined in 36 C.F.R. § 212.1, an over-snow vehicle is:

A motor vehicle that is designed for use over snow and runs on a track or tracks and/or a ski or skis, while in use over snow.

This Order shall become effective upon signature, and will remain in effect for five years from that date, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for a legal entity other than an individual, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559 and 3571).
