



Wildlife/Ecology Internship In Alaska

Wildlife and Ecology internships on the Seward and Glacier Ranger Districts of the Chugach National Forest in south central Alaska!

- The interns will assist with habitat improvement, monitoring and research projects. Specific projects include:
 - bat research using ultrasonic data recorders and assisting wildlife biologists with capturing bats; a forest-wide effort to monitor invasive plant plots; surveying for invasive weeds and rare plants; removing and treating invasive weeds; assisting with bird monitoring surveys (bird point counts); assisting with goshawk surveys; assisting with willow and tree planting; assisting with conservation education programs including Bear Aware, Get Outdoors, and Wings Across America; assisting with measuring recreation use patterns and surveying recreation use as part of a mountain goat study; and assisting with vegetation treatment unit measurement and layout.
- Duties will occur during the summer for approximately three months starting around May 16, 2015.
- Duty station will be the Glacier Ranger District in Girdwood, AK.
- Round-trip travel to Girdwood, AK, bunkhouse space and a daily stipend will be provided.
- Intern must be capable of hiking long days while carrying a 15-25 lb pack (equipment and personal gear).
- Basic FS safety training requirements to work safely in the woods would be provided.
- Personal protective equipment required for work will be provided. Items may include hard hat, gloves, eye protection, hearing protection and other identified equipment. Sturdy footgear and personal rain gear will be the responsibility of the volunteer.
- Camping gear will be provided including backpack, tent, pad, sleeping bag, water filter, cook stove, and utensils. Dry bags and bug repellent will be provided.
