

Appendix: 4 Special Forest Use Regulations

Wallowa-Whitman National Forest

Occupancy and Use

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations Section 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all lands, roads and trails within the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

1. Possession of any beverage, which is defined as an alcoholic beverage by State law, by a person who is under the age of 21 years. *36 CFR 261.58(bb)*
2. Possession of marijuana and/or other controlled substances as defined in Title 21, United States Code, Section 802, paragraph 16, and the prohibitions contained in 21 USC 844 (a). Drug laws are strictly enforced on National Forest lands. *36 CFR 261.58(t)*
3. Motor vehicle used on Forest Roads must be street legal in accordance with state laws. *36 CFR 261.54(a)*
4. Driving under the influence of intoxicants on any Forest Road is prohibited and strictly enforced. *36 CFR 261.54(e)*
5. Operating a motor vehicle on a Forest Road carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the rights or safety of other persons, or in a manner or at a speed that would endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property. *36 CFR 261.54(f)*
6. Operating a vehicle on a Forest Road without a valid state driver's license. *36 CFR 261.54(d)*
7. Camping in excess of 14 days during any 30-day period, except when authorized by a Forest Officer. *36 CFR 261.58(a)*
8. Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of posted instructions. *36 CFR 261.58(g)*
9. Using a vehicle equipped with other than rubber tires, except snowmobiles, on any bridge. *36 CFR 261.54(a)*
10. Using any Forest Road for commercial hauling with a vehicle in excess of 10,000 pounds G.V.W., without a permit. *36 CFR 261.54(c)*
11. See Wallowa-Whitman National Forest district map for restrictions of motorized use of roads, trails, or areas.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months or both.

AREA CLOSURES

This page represents portions of the Travel Opportunity Guide map, which was effective September 1, 1991, as related to Forest Executive Order #233. Portions of this Forest Order have been superseded by future Forest Orders.

Pursuant to 36 CFR Section 261.50 (a) and (b), until further notice, the following acts are prohibited within the below listed areas on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

- *1. Possessing or using a motorized vehicle off Forest development roads (36 CFR 261.56).

- 2 . Using any motorized vehicle prohibited as stated below on Forest development roads (36 CFR 261.54(a)).

- 3 . Using any motorized vehicle prohibited as stated below on Forest development trails (36 CFR 261.55(b)).

4. Landing of aircraft, or dropping or picking up any materials, supplies, or person by means of an aircraft, including a helicopter (36 CFR 261. 58(y)).

5. Going into or being upon any area which is closed for the protection of scientific experiments or investigations, public health or safety (36 CFR 261.53 (d & e)).

Refer to the "Travel Opportunity Guide" map for the appropriate District for information as to the specific location of travel restrictions and open routes within areas with travel restrictions.

* EXCEPT WHERE NOTED in area closures, a 300-foot corridor each side of designated EXCEPTED OPEN ROUTES will be open to camping.

OREGON AREAS

PHILLIPS LAKE The area on and around Phillips Lake located
in T. 10 S., R. 38 E., W.M., Sections 14 through 29.


SOUTH SHORE located in T. 10 S., R. 38 E., W.M., Sections 22, 23, 25, 26, and 27.

NOTE: Other than over-snow vehicles on snow, motorized travel is limited to roads only. The 300-foot corridor is not open to motor vehicle entry

CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES YEARLONG EXCEPT FOR ROUTES DESIGNATED OPEN BELOW.

OPEN ROUTES : Road Nos. 2200200, 2200300, 2200400, 2220, 2220020, 2220460, 2220480, 2230 and watercraft operating on the Lake surface.
