Dear Interested Party:

The Payette National Forest is contacting interested persons, groups, and agencies to make them aware of an intended administrative change to the plan monitoring program in the Payette National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan (Payette Forest Plan). The intended change will modify the current plan monitoring program to be consistent with the plan monitoring program requirements in the 2012 Planning Rule found in Title 36 CFR Section 219.12 (a), as required by Title 36 CFR Section 219.12 (c).

All forest plan monitoring programs must conform to the requirements of the 2012 planning rule by May 9, 2016. We would like to hear your comments and concerns about the proposed modifications to Chapter IV (as amended) of the 2003 Payette Forest Plan.

As required by 36 CFR 219.12(a)(5), each forest plan monitoring program must contain one or more monitoring questions and associated indicators addressing each of the following eight requirements:

1. The status of select watershed conditions
2. The status of select ecological conditions, including key characteristics of terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems
3. The status of focal species to assess the ecological conditions required under § 219.9. .
4. The status of a select set of the ecological conditions required under § 219.9 to contribute to the recovery of federally listed threatened and endangered species, conservation of proposed and candidate species, and maintenance of a viable population of each species of conservation concern,
5. The status of visitor use, visitor satisfaction, and progress toward meeting recreation objectives
6. Measurable changes on the plan area related to climate change and other stressors that may be affecting the plan area
7. Progress toward meeting the desired conditions and objectives in the plan, including providing for multiple use opportunities
8. The effects of each management system to determine that it does not substantially and permanently impair the productivity of the land

The modified plan monitoring program should provide information that is most critical for the Forest Supervisor to determine if a change in Payette Forest Plan direction may be needed. We propose to replace the monitoring elements found in Chapter IV of the Payette Forest Plan.

Once the plan monitoring program is modified to be consistent with the requirements, the Forest Supervisor will conduct a biennial evaluation, as required under Title 36 CFR 219.12 (d). The new information from the biennial evaluation will be documented in a written monitoring and evaluation report that will be made available to the public. The report will indicate whether or not a change to direction in the Payette Forest Plan, Forest management activities, or the plan monitoring program is needed, or if an assessment may be warranted, based on the new information.

The modification to the Payette Forest Plan monitoring program is being conducted under the administrative change procedures of 36 CFR 219.13 (c). The public is provided an opportunity to provide



comment on the intended modifications. During this comment process, the public may identify other monitoring needs and additional information.

As the responsible official for the proposal, I will review public comments to identify new information for consideration in bringing the monitoring program into compliance with the 2012 planning rule. I will work with the Forest Interdisciplinary Team to determine which elements will be included in the program and which elements will be deleted. I will notify the public of my approval of the administrative change to modify the monitoring program of the Payette Forest Plan.

### How You Can Comment

To be most useful in finalizing this administrative change to the monitoring chapter by May 9, 2016, your input should be postmarked or received by May 5, 2016. Input received after this date will be maintained and used to inform future administrative changes to the monitoring chapter as the Forest moves forward with implementation of this monitoring program and identifies if there is a need for future refinements following each subsequent two year evaluation.
