

Standing Dead Cutting Limitations

The removal of standing dead trees is limited by species and size according to the following: Diameters are measured at 4 ½ feet above the ground.

- Ponderosa Pine – Only dead, standing trees less than 12 inches in diameter (38 inches in circumference) or less than 15 feet in height may be removed.
- Pinyon Pine – Only dead, standing trees less than 10 inches in diameter (32 inches in circumference) or less than 12 feet in height may be removed.
- Gambel Oak – Only dead, standing trees less than 8 inches in diameter (25 inches in circumference) or less than 12 feet in height may be removed.

Standing dead oak may only be removed between June 1 and October 15.

- Aspen – Only dead, standing trees less than 12 inches in diameter (38 inches in circumference) or less than 12 feet in height may be removed.

Standing dead aspen may only be removed between June 1 and September 30.

Dead Limbs cannot be cut from live trees.




Unit 1: The unit is 2 ½ miles south of Ash Fork just west of HWY 89. Access to this area is from FR123.
 Unit Detail: Wood consists of small to medium sized Juniper clipped with a hydraulic shearer and is concentrated most along the western portion of the unit.
 Accessibility: High clearance vehicle required, good access to unit but variable interior conditions.

Unit 2: The unit is 3 miles south of Ash Fork just east of HWY89. Access to this area is from FR114.
 Unit Detail: Wood consists of medium to large sized Juniper clipped with a hydraulic shearer in 2012.
 Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicle required, good access to unit but variable interior conditions.

Unit 3: The unit is approximately 5 ½ miles south of Ash Fork just east of HWY 89. Access to this area is from FR9213C.
 Unit Detail: Wood consists of medium sized clipped Juniper and is concentrated most along the western portion of the unit, fencing prevents access from HWY 89 and can only be made from the unit interior.
 Accessibility: High clearance vehicle required, good access to unit but variable interior conditions.

Unit 4G: The unit is approximately 2 miles east of Ash Fork. Access to this area is from I-40 exit 148, FR9731B, toward County Line Rd. Continue straight as road becomes native surface (1.9 miles). Turn right onto FR9731BA, toward County Line Rd, (0.2 miles), and turn right onto FR796, (0.1 miles). The unit is located to the right, once entering the signed unit boundary at the tree line.
 Unit Detail: Green Juniper trees may be cut in this area up to a 14 inch DRC, (44 inch circumference).
 Accessibility: High clearance vehicle required, high stumps and rocky conditions.

Note: Fuelwood can be sparse and intermittent. Availability will vary depending on volume that was cut initially and the area.



Unit 8G: The unit is approximately 11 miles north of Parks / Spring Valley. It can be accessed by taking FR141 (Spring Valley road) north to FR144. Continue north on FR144 past its intersection with FR88. The unit begins ¼ mile north of the intersection of FR144 and FR88. The cutting unit is on the left side (west) of FR144 north to FR736 (AT&T line).
 Unit Detail: Green juniper trees may be cut in this area up to a 12 inch DRC, (38 inch circumference).
 Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicle OK, access to unit is good but interior includes variable conditions.

Unit 9: The unit is approximately 18 miles north of Parks / Spring Valley. It can be accessed by taking FR141 (Spring Valley road) north to FR144. Merge onto FR144 and continue 6 miles north to the FR144 and FR9164A intersection. The unit extends north and to the west of FR144 for approximately 4 miles.
 Unit Detail: Material is comprised of mixed sized Juniper cut from 2008-2012. Large concentrations of material exist in the north western portions of the unit.
 Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicle OK, large flat unit consisting of variable interior conditions.

Unit 10: The unit is 15 miles north of Parks. Take FR141 (Spring Valley road) north to FR144. Continue north on FR144 approximately 10 miles to FR9209B. Turn left and proceed 2 miles to the west, bear left past Rabbit Lake. The unit begins at the fence line, cross at access gate. Please close the gate.
 Unit Detail: Material is comprised of large to medium sized Juniper cut in 2012.
 Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicle OK, large unit of flat ground however FR9209B is heavily rutted and does become extremely muddy under wet conditions.

For Green Juniper Permits
 There are diameter limits to the trees which may be removed, see cutting unit details above for the size limit in the unit you are cutting in, diameters are measured at root collars (DRC).
 Unit boundaries have been designated with paint unless otherwise specified. The boundary of each unit has been marked with horizontal bands of paint approximately 4.5 ft. above ground, facing into the unit.
