2016 Williams Ranger District Free Use Fuelwood Map

Cutting Season: April 15th - December 31st, 2016

Fuelwood Gathering from Within the Designated Free Use Area Requires a Free Use Fuelwood Permit and must be in Possession at the Time of Cutting.

The Free Use Permit is for the Collection of Dead and Downed Wood from within the Designated Free Use Area Only. Standing Dead Wood May Only Be Cut With A Paid Personal Use Permit.

Unit 11F: The unit lies 6 miles south of Williams and can be accessed from CR73 (Perkinsville Rd.). Turn left (east) onto FR140. Unit Detail: Available wood is composed of medium sized Ponderosa Pine, cut during the spring of 2015. Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicles recommended within unit. Wood is available immediately to the right of FR 140. Cross-country travel is NOT PERMITTED within the Unit 11F Boundary.

Unit 5F: The unit lies 8 miles south of Williams and can be accessed from CR73 (Perkinsville Rd.). Turn left (east) onto FR110. Continue for 0.3 miles, turn left onto the Utility Line Rd located just after the posted Fuelwood Sign. Unit Detail: Available wood is composed of medium sized Ponderosa Pine, cut during the fall of 2013. Accessibility: Medium clearance vehicles recommended within unit. Wood is available immediately to the left once entering the unit. Cross-country travel is PERMITTED within the Unit 5F Boundary with a valid fuelwood permit.

Unit 6 - Barney Flats FS Rd 3110: This unit is approximately 6 miles south of Williams. Take CR73 (Perkinsville Rd) south to the junction of CR73 and FS Rd 3110 (across from the corrals). Take a right and go approximately 1 mile to the junction of FS Rd 3110 and 9113. The free use area is on the left side of the road. Unit Detail: Material is larger diameter ponderosa pine that was cut in fall of 2015. Accessibility is good but suggest medium clearance vehicle to directly access wood in unit. Cross-country travel is PERMITTED within the Unit 6 boundary with a valid fuel wood permit.

Unit 12 - Pittman Valley Free Use: Go east from Williams on I-40 approximately 10 miles to exit 171. Exit and then turn left across interstate. At stop sign, across the road, is a gate to FS Rd 051. Go through gate and ponderosa pine which was cut in 2015 is on the left. Unit detail: Material is mixed diameter ponderosa pine. Access is fairly good but suggest medium clearance vehicle. Cross-country travel is PERMITTED within the Unit 12 boundary with a valid fuel wood permit.
