

Sitka

Allen Point

Located on Halleck Island near a tall, dense hemlock-spruce forest. Has a large deck that overlooks Nakwasina Sound. In the 1960s, forested areas were harvested, leaving a vegetation pattern in these areas that appears brighter green in the summer. Brown bear frequent the area. Serves as an excellent base for saltwater fishing and deer hunting.

Access: oar or floatplane.



Appleton Cove

Located on Halleck Island near a tall, dense hemlock-spruce forest. Has a large deck that overlooks Nakwasina Sound. In the 1960s, forested areas were harvested, leaving a vegetation pattern in these areas that appears brighter green in the summer. Brown bear frequent the area. Serves as a base for saltwater fishing and deer hunting.


Access: Boat or floatplane.



Avoss Lake

Situated 5 miles northeast of Whale Bay within the South Baranof Wilderness Area, and serves as an excellent base for a remote backcountry experience that includes photography and hunting. Many streams and small channels flow through the surrounding area. Wildflowers bloom in abundance during spring and summer.

Access: Floatplane.



Baranof Lake

Sits on the shores of glacier-fed Baranof Lake surrounded by a spruce and hemlock forest. The cabin has a small, sandy beach and is located near the mouth of the Baranof River. A beautiful waterfall cascades over steep slopes across the lake. Brown bear frequent the area. Cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and rainbow trout runs occur July-August.

Access: Floatplane.



Brent's Beach

Located on Kruzof Island, just inside the timberline on a beautiful, sandy white beach facing Crab Bay. Surrounded by a dense forest of spruce and hemlock. Brown bears frequent the area. Visitors enjoy beachcombing, sunbathing and sculpting on the white sands in front of the cabin, saltwater fishing in the bay and hunting deer in-season in the surrounding forest.


Access: Boat or helicopter.



Davidoff Lake

Situated in a forested area off Davidoff Lake within the South Baranof Wilderness Area. The area offers solitude and beauty. Spruce and hemlock forested mountains rise 2,000 feet in elevation. Blueberry and huckleberry bushes grow on the forest floor around the cabin. Brown bear frequent the area. Visitors can fish for Dolly Varden, and hunt for deer.

Access: Floatplane.



Fred's Creek

Located on Kruzof Island near a creek and a 6.7-mile hiking trail that leads to Mt. Edgecumbe, a dormant volcano. At the cone, the trail becomes very steep but hikers are rewarded with panoramic views on clear days. Humpback whales, sea otters, sea lions, puffins and other sea birds can be seen. Brown bear frequent the area.

Access: Boat or helicopter.



Goulding Lake

Located on Chichagof Island within the West Chichagof-Yakobi Wilderness Area. Cabin makes an excellent base to explore nearby Otter Lake and Goulding Lake. Cutthroat trout can be caught below the falls and in the lower lake west of the cabin all year. Dolly Varden fishing is year round, while steelhead and Coho are seasonal. Photography opportunities abound.

Access: Floatplane.



Kanga Bay

Overlooks a secluded cove with distant views peaks over Redoubt Bay on Baranof Island. A spruce and hemlock forest surrounds the cabin, which sits just above a sand pebble beach. Deer, brown bear and a variety of seabirds inhabit the area. Visitors enjoy fishing for sockeye and Coho salmon during August at Redoubt Lake, 30 minutes away by boat.

Access: Boat or floatplane.



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Kook Lake

Sits on the west end of Kook Lake. Hiking possible on a network of old logging roads. Tenakee Springs is located across Tenakee Inlet. Cutthroat and Dolly Varden fishing is available year-round in the lake. Good runs of sockeye occur during July and August, and Coho salmon during late August and early September. Seasonal deer and bear hunting is also available.

Access: Boat or floatplane.



Lake Eva

Accessible cabin near the northeast coast of Baranof Island. Set within a spruce and hemlock forest overlooking Lake Eva. Fishing opportunities: cutthroat and Dolly Varden are found in lake year-round. Outlet stream has seasonal runs of steelhead, sockeye, and Coho salmon. Hikers enjoy the Lake Eva-Hanus Bay Trail which can be reached by boat from the cabin.

Access: Floatplane.



Moser Island

On the shore of Moser Island in upper Hoonah Sound. At low tide, the shoreline leads to Chichagof Island. Deer, brown bear and waterfowl are abundant. Beachcombing, seal watching, hunting and fishing, shrimp fishing, and crabbing are available south and east of the island or in nearby bays. Local rivers have Dolly Varden and pink and chum salmon.

Access: Boat or floatplane.



North Beach

Nestled inside the forest fringe on the beach of Shelikof Bay, Kruzof Island. The cabin has spectacular views of the cresting waves on the outside coast of the Gulf of Alaska. It is surrounded by a hemlock and spruce forest. The terrain is relatively flat. Beachcombing, photography, hiking, hunting, fishing, wildlife viewing and riding off-highway vehicles are popular activities.

Access: By boat with hike, or floatplane.



Piper Island

Piper Island Cabin is located inside the forest fringe of Piper Island, overlooking a sandy beach within Schulze Cove, located on the north side of Fish Bay, f Island. The modified A-frame cabin is available year-round, weather permitting. Brown bear frequent the area. Recreational opportunities include beachcombing, wildlife viewing, saltwater fishing, crabbing and seasonal deer hunting.


Access: Boat or floatplane.



Plotnikof Lake

Situated on Baranof Island within the South Baranof Wilderness Area. The view from the cabin includes waterfalls cascading from steep granite slopes that rise to snow-capped ridges. Brown bear frequent the area. Plotnikof Lake and its inlet stream on the north shore offer fair rainbow trout fishing. There are seasonal steelhead and Coho salmon runs on the outlet stream.

Access: Boat or floatplane.



Salmon Lake

Situated on Baranof Island. Visitors enjoy hiking along the 2-mile Salmon Lake-Redoubt Lake Trail, which leads from the cabin to Silver Bay. Recreation options include fishing, hiking and seasonal deer hunting. Salmon Lake offers good cutthroat trout and Dolly Varden fishing, while its outlet stream has seasonal pink and sockeye salmon runs.

Access: By boat with hike, or floatplane.



Samsing Cove

Situated off Sitka Sound on Baranof Island. Abundance of wildlife and sea life. Visitors may spot orca whales and humpback whales, puffins, sea otters and sea lions. Brown bear frequent the area. Recreational opportunities include saltwater fishing, kayaking (bring your own kayak), photography, wildlife viewing and beachcombing.

Access: Boat.



Seven Fathom Bay

Located north of West Crawfish Inlet, outside the South Baranof Wilderness Area on southwest side of Baranof Island. Surrounded by nearly flat terrain at the head of Seven fathom Bay. Brown bear frequent the area. Many hiking opportunities are available despite a lack of established trails. The South Baranof Wilderness Area can be accessed within five minutes by boat.

Access: Boat or floatplane.



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Shelikof

Overlooks an expansive sandy beach of Shelikof Bay on Kruzof Island with spectacular ocean views. Relatively flat and easy terrain surrounds the cabin and is easy to explore. Brown bear frequent the area. Scenic viewing, photography, beachcombing and hiking are popular activities here. Fishing is fair for Dolly Varden, coho and pink salmon in a nearby stream.

Access: Boat plus 7-mile hike, helicopter, or wheeled plane.



Sitkoh Lake East

One of two cabins at Sitkoh Lake on Chichagof Island. Surrounded by towering spruce and hemlock, with muskeg and open meadows. Brown bear frequent the area. Offers fishing, hiking, hunting, off-highway vehicle riding, and berry picking. The lake supports cutthroat trout and Dolly Varden. Sitkoh Creek has runs of steelhead, and pink, sockeye, and Coho salmon.

Access: Boat plus 7-mile hike, helicopter, or wheeled plane.



Sitkoh Lake West

One of two cabins at Sitkoh Lake on Chichagof Island. Surrounded by towering spruce and hemlock, with muskeg and open meadows. The lake's inlet creek is nearby. Brown bear frequent the area. Offers fishing, hiking, hunting, off-highway vehicle riding, and berry picking. The lake supports cutthroat trout and Dolly Varden. Sitkoh Creek has runs of steelhead, and pink, sockeye, and Coho salmon.

Access: Boat plus 7-mile hike, helicopter, or wheeled plane.



Starrigavan Creek

Drive-up cabin situated in the Starrigavan Recreation Area which houses a diverse range of forest, estuary and marine habitats. Visitors may view brown bear, spawning Coho and pink salmon, many bird varieties, river otter or Sitka black-tailed deer. Brown bear frequent the area. Visitors enjoy fishing, kayaking, photography, hiking and birding.

Access: Boat plus 7-mile hike, helicopter, or wheeled plane.



Suloia Lake

Sits on the shore of Suloia Lake on Chichagof Island in the West Chichagof-Yakobi Wilderness Area. The cabin is surrounded by dense forest of cedar, spruce and hemlock with small gravel beach in front. Brown bear frequent the area. Suloia Lake offers wilderness solitude, fishing and deer hunting opportunities, as well as limited hiking options.

Access: Floatplane.



White Sulphur Springs

Located on Chichagof Island within the West Chichagof-Yakobi Wilderness Area. A forest of spruce and hemlock surrounds the cabin, which overlooks beautiful views of the North Pacific with breakers crashing on nearby rocky cliffs. Brown bear frequent the area. Recreation options include fishing, boating, hiking, photography and soaking in the natural, warm White Sulphur Springs pool.

Access: Boat.
