

# Admiralty

## Admiralty Cove

On a forested beach overlooking Admiralty Creek. Wildlife viewing includes Steller sea lions, humpback whales, harbor seals, waterfowl, and brown bears. Cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and Coho salmon fishing is available. The 4.5-mile Admiralty Cove-Young Lake heads from the cabin to the North Young Lake Cabin. It is a scenic setting for hiking, beachcombing, and berry picking.

Access: Boat or float plane.



## Big Shaheen

One of three on Hasselborg Lake, which is seven miles long and part of the Admiralty Island Canoe Route. Dense spruce and hemlock forests, glacier-fed streams, lakes and muskeg openings define the landscape. The lake offers fishing for cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and kokanee salmon. Wildlife include Sitka black-tailed deer, bald eagles, and brown bears.


Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



## Chuch Bight

On level ground by a tidal saltwater cove within Gambier Bay on Admiralty Island. The shoreline is surrounded by old-growth spruce and hemlock trees, shrubs and grasses. Wildlife includes migratory waterfowl and shorebirds, Sitka black-tailed deer and brown bears. Fly fishing for Dolly Varden and rainbow available in nearby streams, and halibut and rockfish in further open waters.

Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



## Florence Lake East

Remote site on Admiralty Island offers a scenic setting for fishing, boating, and wildlife viewing, including Sitka black-tailed deer, brown bears, bald eagles and waterfowl which are in abundance on the island's many lakes. Florence Lake offers fishing for rainbow trout, Dolly Varden and northern pike. Beachcombers may find Japanese fishing floats, shells, bottles, and other wave-swept treasures from the open ocean.

Access: Float plane.



## Hasselborg Creek

One of three cabins on Hasselborg Lake, which is seven miles long and part of the Admiralty Island Canoe Route. Dense spruce and hemlock forests, glacier-fed streams, lakes and muskeg openings define the landscape, while rocky peaks tower along the island's high crest, reaching elevations of 3,000 feet. Hiking, fishing, canoeing and wildlife viewing are all available near the cabin.

Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



## Jims Lake

Located on the northwest end of Jim's Lake on Admiralty Island. The lake is a scenic setting for catching cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and kokanee salmon. The cabin is hemmed in by dense old-growth forest with views to distant glacier-capped peaks. Wildlife in the area abounds. Sitka black-tailed deer navigate dense forests and bald eagles perch in treetops along most beaches. Brown bear frequent the area as well.

Access: Float plane.



## Lake Alexander

Situated under a canopy of old-growth forest, overlooking scenic Lake Alexander. Anglers can catch cutthroat trout and Dolly Varden. A 2.4-mile trail from the east end of the lake goes to Mole Harbor. Wildlife in the area abounds. Sitka black-tailed deer find habitat in the dense forest and bald eagles perch in treetops along most beaches. Brown bear frequent the area as well.

Access: Float plane or canoe/kayak with portage.



## Lake Kathleen

Sits near a small beach beneath a canopy of old-growth trees. Much of the surrounding private land has been clearcut. Wildlife includes Sitka black-tailed deer, bald eagles in treetops along most beaches and migratory waterfowl on numerous lakes. Brown bears are in abundance. Anglers will find Kathleen Lake to be a scenic setting for catching a variety of fish including rainbow trout, Dolly Varden and northern pike.


Access: Float plane.



## Little Shaheen

One of three cabins on Hasselborg Lake which is part of the Admiralty Island Canoe Route. Situated under a canopy of an old growth forest of spruce and hemlock. Wildlife includes Sitka black-tailed deer, bald eagles perched in treetops, and brown bear. Anglers will find Hasselborg Lake to be a scenic setting for catching cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and kokanee salmon.

Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



# Admiralty

## Pybus Bay

North of Donkey Bay in a protected cove within Pybus Bay. Surrounded by spruce and hemlock trees, ferns, shrubs and grasses. The end of the bay has large tidal flats. Wildlife includes migratory waterfowl and shorebirds, Sitka black-tailed deer and brown bears. Pybus Bay is a good place for humpback whale sightings. Seasonal commercial fishing activity is popular.

Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



## Young Lake North

The remote site in Kootznoowoo Wilderness offers hiking, fishing, boating, berry picking and wildlife viewing. Dense spruce and hemlock forests, glacier-fed streams, lakes and muskeg openings define the landscape. Wildlife includes Sitka black-tailed deer stay, bald eagles and bears, which frequent the area during salmon runs July through August. Anglers enjoy Young Lake for catching cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and Coho salmon.

Access: Float plane.



## Sportsmen

One of two cabins on Distin Lake, located on the north side and within the Admiralty Island Canoe Route. Offers a scenic setting for hiking, fishing, canoeing and wildlife viewing within the vicinity. Wildlife in the area abounds, including Sitka black-tailed deer, bald eagles, waterfowl and brown bear. Anglers catch cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and kokanee salmon.

Access: Float plane or canoe with portage.



## Young Lake South

The remote site in Kootznoowoo Wilderness offers hiking, fishing, boating, berry picking and wildlife viewing. Dense spruce and hemlock forests, glacier-fed streams, lakes and muskeg openings define the landscape. Wildlife includes Sitka black-tailed deer stay, bald eagles and bears, which frequent the area during salmon runs July through August. Anglers enjoy Young Lake for catching cutthroat trout, Dolly Varden and Coho salmon.

Access: Boat or float plane.




# Hoonah

## Eight Fathom

Built on a road next to tidal, estuary flats at the head of Port Frederick. y and wildlife, which includes whales, brown bear, deer, shorebirds and a variety of small mammals. The front deck of the cabin looks out over the tide flats and the surrounding mountains. The cabin is backed by dense evergreen forest. Good access to hunting and fishing. Beach in front of the cabin is suitable for landing and launching small boats.

Access: Boat or float plane.



## Greentop

In the West Chichagof-Yakobi Wilderness Area on flat terrain near the rocky coastline of Yakobi Island. Protected from ocean by Greentop Harbor. Offers abundant seashore life and beautiful scenery. Deer, brown bear and sea otters are seen. There are excellent opportunities for sea kayaking and boating in the numerous coves and protected bays at high tide.

Access: Boat or float plane.
