Danskin Trail System is scheduled to open April 11.

The managed opening for the Trinity Recreation Area is July 15.

Forest visitors can get to these campgrounds but there are no services:

- **Middle Fork Boise River** - Irish Point, Cottonwood CG, Willow Creek CG, Badger Creek CG, Troutdale CG
- **South Fork Boise River** - Village, Indian Point, Cow Creek,
- **Blacks Creek area** - Bender Creek TH, Willow Creek TH, 3 Point Mountain TH
- **Anderson Ranch Area** - Elk Creek Boat Ramp,

Areas that the snow have a few inches of snow remaining:

- **Elks Flat CG**
- **Curlew Boat Ramp**

Visitors cannot drive past Fall Creek Boat Ramp on Forest Road #123, or past the Pine Campground on Forest Road #128. These are County maintained road systems.

Deadwood Reservoir and Bull Trout Lake Areas are scheduled to open in late June or early July.

- Mountain View Campground does not have a gate and is free of snow.
- Pine Flats and Kirkham Campgrounds do have gates.
- Campgrounds are scheduled to open May 22.
