








Using existing shade

Procedure When Planting With a Hoe

<p>1</p>  <p>Drive the hoe in full length and as near to perpendicular as possible.</p>	<p>2</p>  <p>Raise up on the handle to open the bottom of the hole.</p>	<p>3</p>  <p>Pull back the upper part, making a clean square hole.</p>
<p>4</p>  <p>Place the roots straight down into the middle of the hole, setting it the same depth it was in the nursery.</p>	<p>5</p>  <p>Push a portion of the soil into the hole, packing it firmly around the lower roots.</p>	<p>6</p>  <p>Finish filling the hole and tamp firmly.</p>
<p>7</p>  <p>Pack the upper part. This tree is set correctly.</p>	<p>Improper closure</p>  <p>The soil is pushed into the hole from one side.</p>	<p>Improper closure</p>  <p>The roots are jammed into one narrow plane, resulting in poor water absorption.</p>
