The Enoree Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Trail travels along rolling piedmont hills and pine forests. With interconnecting loops, riders have an opportunity for rides of various length. The trail is only managed for all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and dirt bikes. Jeeps, Hummers and other 4 x 4 vehicles are not allowed on trails. The maximum ATV width the trail will accommodate is 50 inches.

Directions: From I-26 take the Joanna/Whitmire exit (SC 66). Go east toward Whitmire about 4 miles to Stomp Springs Rd. Turn left, go about 2.5 miles to Garlington School Road (FS 366). Turn right. Go .5 mile to trailhead parking on right.

Difficulty: easy to moderately difficult

Facilities:

- Restrooms
- Pull-through parking spaces
- Loading ramp

Fees: \$5/OHV/day, or \$50/person/season (seasonal passes may be used only by the individual to whom the pass is issued). Volunteers who contribute at a Forest Service certified trail outings may be issued a complimentary yearly pass.

Length: 23 miles

Drinking Water: Not available

Safety: Care should be taken in the woods during big-game season. Wear blaze orange. Riding gear recommended.

Seasonal Closure: From the first Monday after Jan. 1 through the last Thursday in March yearly.

Surface Type: Sand and Piedmont clay.


Trail Markings: One-way trails sections marked in orange. Two-way sections marked in white.

Travel Time: from 1/2 to 3 hours


