

Order No. 06-15-03-16-357
Umpqua Hot Springs Day Use Designation and No Parking Closure
UMPQUA NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited within the Diamond Lake Ranger District of the Umpqua National Forest. The order is effective from April 19, 2016 and ending April 19, 2018 unless sooner rescinded.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands after sundown and before sunrise. Overnight use, including dispersed camping, in the vicinity of the Umpqua Hot Springs is prohibited. The Day Use Only Area begins at the intersection of Forest Service Road (FS) 3401 and FS Road 3400-010, then continues east along FS Road 3401 to the Loafer Creek drainage crossing located ¼ mile east of FS Road 3401-200, then continues northwesterly to FS Road 3400-100, then continues southwesterly along FS Road 3400-100 and powerline corridor (cleared of trees and including FS Road 3400-104 and FS Road 3400-010) to its starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.58(l).
2. Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of posted instructions. Vehicle parking along FS Road 3401 within 300 feet on either side parallel to centerline of the road, with the exception of the Umpqua Hot Springs Trailhead Parking Lot, is prohibited by this closure order. The area boundary begins at the intersection of FS Road 3401 and FS Road 3400-100, then continues east along FS Road 3401 to the Loafer Creek crossing at the Winter Night Camp, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R § 261.58(g).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.


These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.


