

**UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, FOREST SERVICE
HUMBOLDT-TOIYABE NATIONAL FOREST, CARSON RANGER DISTRICT**

Long Valley Area and Road Closure Order Revised

A. PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area and roads, as described in this order, on the Carson Ranger District, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest until further notice.

It is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

- 1) Public Health or Safety [36 CFR 261.53(e)]**
- 2) Being on the road [36 CFR 261.54(e)]**

B. EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following is exempt from this order.

1. Persons with a permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, County or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Any contractor or sub-contractor engaged with the Long Valley Aspen Enhancement Stewardship Contract.

C. AREA DESCRIBED

The area displayed in Exhibit A is described as:

The Long Valley Stewardship Sale Area along Sierra County Road #570, from just east of Forest Service Road 31131, (approximately 7 miles southwest of Bordertown, Nevada), and continuing southwest approximately 1 mile along Sierra County Road #570, then approximately 0.7 miles southwest in section 10, where it intersects the Sierra County Road #570 again, just north of Forest Service Road 31033 (Crystal Peak Mine Road). The Long Valley Stewardship Sale boundary is marked with orange flagging and blue signs and the closure includes all log landings within or near the sale area.

Includes a portion of Forest Service road 31187, from where it intersects Sierra County #570, just west of Forest Service road #31131 and progresses approximately ½ mile south, to the top of the hill.

The legal description is: T20N, R17E sections 2, 10 and 11, Mount Diablo Meridian.

D. PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to protect public health, well being and safety. Long Valley Aspen Enhancement is a stewardship contract that includes felling and removal of trees to landings and removal of logs and slash off National Forest System lands. Logs are currently decked on Log

Landings (stacks of logs); these landings are not safe to climb on or around. Hauling of the logs in the log landings and some felling of trees is on-going.

E. IMPLEMENTATION

- 1) This Special Order implementing Area Closure Restrictions is effective at 17:00 P.M. on February 19, 2016, and shall remain in effect until rescinded.
- 2) Exhibit A - Map and Exhibit B - Definitions are attached and incorporated into this ORDER.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable as a class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization and/or imprisonment of not more than 6 months [Title 16 USC 551, 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].

EXHIBIT A - Map




EXHIBIT B

DEFINITIONS

Area and Road Closure Restrictions

AREA: Means a discrete, specifically delineated space that is smaller, and in most cases much smaller, than a Ranger District.

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROAD: Means forest roads other than a road which has been authorized by legally documented right-of-way held by a State, county or other local public road authority.

FOREST ROAD AND TRAIL: means a road or trail wholly or partly within or adjacent to and serving the National Forest System that the Forest Service determines is necessary for the protection, administration, and utilization of the National Forest System and the use and development of its resources.

For further definitions or clarification of definitions, refer to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.2.


