TRIBAL RELATIONS

FOSTERING COMMUNICATION AND COOPERATION IN HISTORIC PRESERVATION PLANNING

Section 101 (d) (1) (A) of the National Historic Preservation Act states that the Secretary shall foster communication and cooperation between Indian tribes and State Historic Preservation Officers in the administration of the national historic preservation program, and to encourage coordination among Indian tribes, State Historic Preservation Officers, and Federal agencies in historic preservation planning.

The Sierra National Forest works diligently to foster and maintain communication with the local Native American community through activities such as field trips, tribal forums, planning meetings, and Government to Government consultation.
