I presented a quick overview of the plan revision status to the Kettle Falls Rotary Club at Sandy's Restaurant, Kettle Falls, March 3, 2016. I coordinated with Ed Kowitz, Kettle Falls Rotary Club, 509-680-1836, to set up the presentation date & time. Meeting started at 7:00 with approximately 10 Rotary Club members. Plan revision presentation started at 7:30 and ended at 8:00. Meeting was informal.

Discussion covered:

- age of current plan,
- differences between alternatives related to recommended wilderness, timber output, road management,
- covered that plan does not make site-specific decisions such as specific OHV routes or opening/closing trails
- what the documents look like & where to get more information.

Question topics included:

- For recommended wilderness areas - what is difference between how they are managed now and would be managed under revised plan
A large part of the area recommended for wilderness under the preferred alternative are inventoried roadless areas, so there would not be much change.
- Maps don't include areas burned this past summer – shouldn't that be reflected in the new plan
The plan is high level management direction and would still allow the forest to respond to fires and to any needed rehab/salvage work
- Are there changes to non-motorized trails
No site-specific trail decisions are included in the draft plan

Handed out plan revision business cards for anyone that wanted the website information. Two individuals took CDs: John Ridlington & Ed Kowitz. Did not get email or physical mailing addresses for either individual.
