### Stanislaus National Forest

**Topic: Tree Mortality on the Stanislaus National Forest Topic:**

May 6, 2016

With more than 29 million dead trees in the state of California, the Stanislaus National Forest is busy planning and implementing more than a dozen high-priority projects. Local and statewide resources are assigned and assisting to these efforts. The Stanislaus National Forest has removed a total of **5,707** dead trees from high hazard areas on the forest due to the recent surge in mortality. The forest removed 1,012 trees the week of May 2- May 5.

Groveland Ranger District (HWY 120): 2S09Y HT; Big Creek Shaft North Property Line HT; Groveland Ranger Station Admin Site HT; Peach Growers Tract HT; Spinning Wheel Campground HT; The Pines Campground HT; Wagner Ridge Fuelbreak East; and Wagner Ridge Fuelbreak West.

Mi-Wok Ranger District (HWY 108): 4N01- Spring Gap to Crandall; 4N95/Jeness Park HT; Cold Springs Property Boundary; Crandall OHV Campground; Hull Meadow Property Boundary; Peter Pan Property Boundary; and Thommy Roads.

Groveland Ranger District (HWY120): Cherry Lake Road HT (7 trees); Cherry Lake Road HT Abatement; Hetch Hetchy Transmission; Lost Claim Campground (120 trees); PG&E Powerlines - Curtis 1704 (920 trees); Sweetwater Campground (171 trees).

Mi-Wok Ranger District (HWY 108): Cedar Ridge Property Boundary (7 trees); Hacienda Campground (19 trees); North Fork Picnic Area; Sierra Outdoor School (17 trees).
