

GANDY DANCER TIMBER SALE Highlights

- The Gandy Dancer Timber Sale is located approximately 12.8 miles north of Kenton and is accessed by Skoglund Road and FR1100.
- Downward Market Adjustments were applied to all species and product groups [-10% to all species and product groups].
- There are 1.59 miles of Specified Road Reconstruction, 0.52 miles of Specified Road Construction and 0.10 miles of Pre-haul Maintenance of roads as part of this contract.
- Material will need to be loaded with an Excavator in the Onion Creek Pit.
- There is an estimated 262 ccf of Mixed Hardwood Sawtimber, 175 ccf of Sugar Maple Sawtimber and 1,485 ccf of Mixed Hardwood pulpwood which is comprised by approximately 733 ccf of Sugar Maple.
