BIRDING CODE OF ETHICS:

- Promote the welfare of birds and their environment
 - Support the protection of important bird habitat.
 - Avoid stressing birds or exposing them to danger, exercise restraint and caution during observation.
 - Keep well back from nest sites, roosts, display areas and important feeding areas.
 - Before advertising the presence of a rare bird, evaluate the potential for disturbance to that bird, its surroundings and other people in the area. Nest sites of rare birds should only be reported to the proper conservation authorities.
 - Stay on roads, trails and paths where they exist, otherwise keep habitat disturbance to a minimum. Follow all travel regulations on public lands.
- Respect the law and rights of others
 - Do not enter private property without permission.
 - Know applicable rules and regulations on public lands.
 - Practice common courtesy in contacts with other people.
 - Follow the principles of Leave No Trace - www.int.org
- Ensure that feeders, nest structures, and other artificial bird environments are safe
 - Keep seed dry, clean and free of decay and disease.
 - Remain reliable when feeding birds, especially during harsh winters.
 - Maintain and clean nest structures regularly.
 - Ensure that birds attracted by feeders or other means are not exposed to predation from domestic animals, such as cats, or to other artificial hazards.
 - Bring in bird feeders and bird food at night to avoid attracting bears, spring thru fall.
