As part of the national initiative, Every Kid in a Park, which encourages every fourth grader in the nation to visit federal lands for free, the Kisatchie National Forest will honor the Every Kid in a Park Pass. In addition to all fourth graders, the Kisatchie welcomes our current U.S. military members and dependents in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, Reserves and National Guard to enjoy free admission to recreation sites such as Kincaid Day Use, Caney Day Use, Stuart Lake Day Use, Kisatchie Bayou Day Use, and all Boat Launches with fees. Trails Use permits and camping fees are not included with these special passes.
