

ORDER NO. 06-01-01-16-001
PAULINA LAKE C.G. HAZARD TREE CLOSURE
DESCHUTES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Bend Fort Rock Ranger District of the Deschutes National Forest. This Order is effective from June 6th 2016, until June 17th 2016 when the hazard trees have been removed.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Hazard Tree Area. The Hazard Tree Area includes the Paulina Lake Campground, Paulina Lake Boat Launch, and Paulina Lake Day Use Area. The Hazard Tree area boundary begins at the intersection of Forest Road 21 and Forest Road 21-505 and, then continues east along Forest Road 21 to its intersection with Forest Road 21-530, then continues north along Forest Road 21-530 to its intersection with the lakeshore of Paulina Lake, then continues west along the Paulina Lake lakeshore to its intersection with the Forest Road 21-505, then continues south along Forest Road 21-505 back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System road within the Hazard Tree Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e).
3. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Hazard Tree Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons under a special use authorization that allows the otherwise prohibited activity, and approved contractors and their agents directly engaged in approved work outlined in an operating plan or permit.
3. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
