<b>Safety Reminder</b>	Year-round		Forest weather may change rapidly any time of year. Check the current road, trail & weather conditions before your trip. Weather patterns may create hazardous conditions on forest service roads or trails. Be prepared for all conditions & know before you go.
<b>Skokomish Lower South Fork Trail #873</b>	5/22/2016	Hiking	Good trail.
<b>Church Creek #871 &amp; Chapel Peak</b>	5/29/2016	Hiking, Climbing	The Church Creek trail was in generally good condition from the East trail head (TH) to the pass. There is some significant, large, blowdown (at least 2-3 trees with 3' diameter) from the pass down to Satsop Lake, but it was still navigable. The trail was a little brushy at the pass. The spur road up to the TH (2361-600?) was undergoing some maintenance, and seemed to be in pretty good condition overall (care needs to be exercised when driving through the water bars). I also climbed Chapel Peak from the pass; it was quite a bush-whack, with interesting scrambling to reach the summit (not recommended unless you are equipped for off trail navigation and are comfortable with scrambling some class 3 terrain).
<b>Wonder Mountain</b>	5/30/2016	Climbing	We climbed the East summit of Wonder Mountain via a southerly rib. The road in, FS 2355, was in good condition for the first 4 miles or so (two trees leaning over the road), but the last 3 miles or so, before the old Steel Creek crossing (where the vehicles should park), were getting pretty rutted and the water bars were almost not possible to cross for anything but a high clearance off-road vehicle. It was a good climb, though very, very steep, route finding skills are required.
<b>Copper Creek Trail #876</b>	5/30/2016	Hiking	Trail was in excellent condition. The wooden stair risers, necessary because of the steepness, can be slippery, so go down slowly and carry a hiking stick(s).
<b>Deer Ridge #846</b>	6/4/2016	Hiking	A heartfelt thankyou to the trail crew for doing such a fine job on the blowdowns. Trail is free of snow all the way to the end of the road at Deer Park. Still some snow on the Rainshadow Trail at the summit on Blue Mountain. One down tree inside the park .2 miles from the park boundary, easy step over. Rhodies were in full bloom.
<b>Colonel Bob #851</b>	6/5/2016	Hiking, Camping	Awesome view, a few small patches of snow left, trail brushy with salmon berry in several spots, accessed from Pete's Creek TH
<b>Tunnel Creek #841</b>	6/4/2016	Hiking	Lots and lots of downed trees across trail. All easily passable on foot. Photos and report sent to local trail crews.

<b>Tubal Cain Trail #840 (to Tull City &amp; beyond)</b>	6/8/2016	Hiking	Rhodies still beautiful. Lots of water in the creeks. Plenty of snow in the valley above Tull City...easy to walk on.
<b>Mount Ellinor #812</b>	6/9/2016	Hiking	Ran into 2 goats about halfway up and then 1 on the summit. Snow conditions were slushy but were easily transited.
<b>Fletcher Canyon Trail #858</b>	6/8/2016	Hiking, Camping, Trail Maintenance	Trail in generally good condition. Salmonberry bushes are overwhelming the trail just before the foot log over the creek.
<b>Elk Lake #805</b>	6/17/2016	Hiking	First time I hiked this trail. It was a pleasant hike, primary purpose was photography and I was able to get a few good photos of the small waterfalls along the creek flowing from the lake.
