Title II Funds will be used by Tooele County to implement treatments on weed species the county and District partnership agree are a priority for treatment. These weed species and locations will be determined each year at a coordination meeting between Tooele County Weed Supervisor Jerry Caldwell and the District Weed Coordinator. The intent is to treat species and locations in areas on the NF lands that are adjacent to treatments being conducted by the County on private lands. This efficiency will help focus other areas within the National Forest not adjacent to private lands to be treated by the Forest Service.

The project will accomplish the goals and objectives of treating noxious weeds on FS Lands in areas that are currently adjacent to private land treatments being conducted by Tooele County. This reduces multiple trips by multiple agencies to the same general area, and helps prevent spread of weeds across land ownerships. This project will also allow the county to treat new occurrences that may appear on public land from private land with the ability to quickly and effectively treat those new occurrences before they expand and get larger. All treatments within the Vernon Unit will benefit Sage Grouse habitat on public lands.
