

SPECIAL TRAIL CLOSURE
CALICO TRAIL# 208
SAN JUAN NATIONAL FOREST
ORDER NUMBER SJ-2016-02

Pursuant to Title 16 United States Code §551, and 36 Code of Federal Regulations §261.50(b), the following is prohibited on the Mancos/Dolores Ranger District of the San Juan National Forest as of May 6,2016. This order shall be in effect until May 1, 2017, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first. The trail closed pursuant to this Order is further depicted on the attached map which is hereby incorporated in this Order as Exhibit A. In addition, signs will be posted at both ends of the closed trail in accordance with 36 C.F.R. § 261.51(b).

The purpose of this order is to prevent rutting of the trail, and the establishment of new routes around damaged areas, both of which can result in increased maintenance costs and undesirable wetland impacts.

PROHIBITION:

- 1) Being on that portion of the Calico Trail #208 that runs from the northern trailhead (T41N R11W SEC 25) south approximately 4 miles to the point at which the trail breaks above tree line (T41N R11W SEC 10). 36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a)

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Any federal, state or local official, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an authorized official duty; or
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
3. Forest Service maintenance crews engaged in the performance of their official work related duties.
4. Snowmobiles operating over snow.

Violations of the prohibition are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by fines of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization and up to six months imprisonment, or both (18 U.S.C. §§ 3559 and 3571).
