Get Involved in Forest Plan Revision

The Inyo, Sequoia and Sierra National Forests are revising their land management plans (forest plans). This will set the vision and direction for these forests for the next 15-20 years.

National forests provide areas for: hiking, backpacking, fishing, off-highway travel, and wildlife habitat. They contribute to local economic vitality and are sources for clean drinking water for people across California. National forests include ecosystems such as the Giant Sequoia National Monument and the Ancient Bristlecone Pine Forest.

Forest plans guide how the Forest Service manages national forests. We have been working with the public, area tribes, and local, state and federal agencies for several years to revise these three forest plans, ultimately leading to a draft environmental impact statement and draft forest plans that we
