These are your 2016 Annual Operation Instructions for the Blucher Creek and East Squaw Creek allotments. This AOI has been developed from your annual application and should be considered an extension of your Term Grazing Permit.

For the East Squaw Allotment, it is especially important to have all the cattle in the appropriate pasture on the dates they are planned to be grazed. Range inspections may occur several times during the grazing season to check maintenance of range improvements, forage utilization, and compliance with the grazing rotation and other standard requirements. Range improvements must be maintained prior to placing cattle on the allotment.

Grizzly bears have been observed on these allotments. Please contact Zack Turnbull, Wyoming Game and Fish Department, if you have suspected losses or other issues: 307-360-7336. Any carcass or animals remains will be moved at least 100 yards from live water, trails and roads. Animal carcasses in highly visible areas need to be relocated to more remote areas.

No ground disturbing activities should be conducted on Forest by the permittee or their personnel without approval from the Range Specialist or District Ranger. Motorized vehicles cannot be used off open roads without written approval from the District Ranger. It is your responsibility to be familiar with our Travel Plan and which roads are open to motorized travel.


Because of increasing public use, gates are often left open and cattle stray in to the wrong pasture. I realize this is a problem and an inconvenience. However, it is still the permittee's responsibility to keep their animals in the proper unit. Routine checks need to be made by you and your rider(s).

I have enclosed an Actual Use Report which you may use to record Actual Use data for the 2016 grazing season. Please record the date and number of cattle turned onto the allotment, the dates the cattle are moved to and from each pasture on the rotation, and the number of cattle removed



from the allotment. Accurate records of these dates will help us manage the allotment. In addition, please record labor and cost associated with maintaining the improvements on your allotment. The Forest Service uses these records to help allocate Range Betterment Funds. These funds are used to purchase materials for improvement.
