Fire Prevention Restrictions Order
CA-170-16-01

Pursuant to 43 U.S.C. 1701 *et seq.* and the Code of Federal Regulations (43 CFR § 9212.2), the following restrictions shall apply to all Bureau of Land Management administered Public Lands within the boundaries of the Bishop Field Office beginning Friday, July 1st, 2016 at 12:01 a.m. These restrictions shall apply until Monday, October 31th, 2016. If conditions improve this Fire Prevention Restrictions Order may be rescinded at an earlier date.

1. It is prohibited to build, maintain, attend, or use any open fire, campfire, or charcoal or wood barbecue or stove except within a designated campsite with a fire ring or fire pit specifically provided for such use in the following developed recreation sites: **Tuttle Creek, Goodale Creek, Horton Creek, Crowley Lake, and Pleasant Valley Pit campgrounds**. Portable stoves using gas, jelled petroleum or pressurized liquid fuel are exempt from this restriction when accompanied by a valid "Camp Fire Permit" (43 CFR § 9212.1(h)).
2. It is prohibited to possess or discharge any fireworks (43 CFR § 9212.1(h)).
3. Smoking is prohibited except within an enclosed vehicle or building, or within developed recreation sites shown on Attachment A, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials (43 CFR § 9212.1(h)).
4. It is prohibited to weld or operate acetylene or other torches with an open flame (43 CFR § 9212.1(h)).
5. It is prohibited to use any type of explosive (43 CFR § 9212.1 (h)).

Pursuant to 43 CFR § 9212.2 (3), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
2. Any federal, state, or local law enforcement officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

The area, roads, and trails affected by this order consist of all Bureau of Land Management administered Public Lands within the boundaries of the Bishop Field Office, located within Mono County and Inyo County, California as depicted on Attachment A (map) (43 CFR § 9212.2(1)). Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than 12 months, or both (43 CFR § 9212.4).
