

**Forest Order
USDA Forest Service
Bighorn National Forest
Tongue Ranger District
Sheridan, Wyoming**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551 and 36 CFR 261.50 Subpart B, the following acts are prohibited in the Bighorn National Forest on Forest Service Road 193 and a portion of Forest Service Trail 430 (Restricted Road and Trail) as shown on the attached map as Exhibit A, Tongue Ranger District, Sheridan County, Wyoming.

The Restricted Road is further identified as that portion of Forest Service Road 193 from its juncture with U.S. Highway 14 to the point where it dead ends at the trailhead for Trail 430. The Restricted Trail is identified where it begins from the trailhead at the dead-end of Road 193 to a junction with the spur of the trail approximately 0.5 mile from the start of the trail, located in Section 9 of T. 55N R. 88W. The Restricted Road and Trail are located in T. 55N R 88W Sections 4, 5, 8 and 9. The Restricted Road and Trail include the large parking area at the junction of U.S. Highway 14 (T. 55N R 88W Section 4) and the parking area/trailhead at the dead end and trailhead parking area (T. 55N R. 88W Section 5) of the Restricted Road.

The purpose of this Special Order is to protect public safety within the construction area of the Shutts Flat Project area in cooperation with Wyoming Department of Transportation and associated contractors.

Prohibition

Possession or use of a motor vehicle on the Restricted Road and Trail and associated parking areas and trailhead (36 CFR 261.54(a)).

Exemptions

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

This order is in effect until rescinded or until August 31, 2016, whichever occurs first.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 and 3571).
