NORTHERN HILLS RANGER DISTRICT
TEMPORARY AREA CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551, and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 261.50 (a), the following act is prohibited on the National Forest System lands as described in this Order and as shown on the map attached as Exhibit A, all within the Northern Hills Ranger District, Black Hills National Forest.

The Restricted Area is further described as that area that encompasses the Forest boundary north of Crow Peak, Forest Service Road 214 from Hillsvie Road (Higgins Gulch) to Forest Service Road 639 and from Forest Service Road 639.1 to Forest Service Road 130 north to the Forest boundary.

The purpose of the Order is to provide for public safety and safe egress of fire vehicles in the vicinity of the Crow Peak Fire.

PROHIBITION:

1. Going into or being upon the Restricted Area. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(c)

EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this order:


1. Persons with special use authorization or other Forest Service authorization specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Federal or State administrative personnel in performance of an official duty.

This Order will be in effect from the date it is signed, and continue through August 1, 2016 or until rescinded, whichever occurs first.

This Order supersedes any previous Order(s) prohibiting the same, or similar acts prohibited by this Order in the area covered by this Order.
