

## Cutting Your Firewood:

This **brochure, the permit, and the person named on it** must be present while cutting and transporting the wood.

Firewood includes spruce, fir, aspen, or lodgepole pine but **MUST BE DEAD**. You may cut both standing and down dead trees.

**DO NOT CUT** standing dead conifer trees that are 18” or larger in diameter at 4.5’.

**DO NOT CUT** or remove any trees or down wood within 300 feet of streams or lakes.

**DO NOT** gather firewood within developed recreation areas or campgrounds.

Wood bigger than 8” in diameter must be hauled in pieces shorter than 8 feet.

Stumps **MUST** be cut so that the top of the stump is less than 12 inches from the ground.

Scatter the limbs and pieces of wood you leave so that none of it is more than 2 feet high above the ground.

Vehicles must stay on designated forest roads when gathering firewood allowing for other vehicles to easily pass.

Areas shown on the map, including active and planned timber sales are closed to firewood cutting.

## Measuring Your Firewood:

A cord of wood is a tightly stacked pile of wood measuring 4’ x 4’ x 8’ (128 cubic feet). A full size pickup filled level with the bed rails is about ½ of a cord. Measure and record your load on the permit each time you haul it out.
