FOREST ORDER  
National Forest System Roads and Trails  
COLVILLE NATIONAL FOREST

Three Rivers Ranger District  
Kettle Falls, Washington  
and  
Republic Ranger District  
Republic, Washington

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551 and 36 CFR 261.50 (b) and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Three Rivers and Republic Ranger Districts of the Colville National Forest. This closure is effective beginning April 22, 2016 and will remain in effect until terminated.

**Being on a road National Forest System road. 36 CFR 261.54 (e).** For the purpose of this order, all methods of travel and use are prohibited on the following National Forest System roads:

- 2030380, 2030900, 2030920, 2030921, 2030921A
- 6100050, 6100078, 6100080, 6100220, 6100350, 6100400, 6100420, 6100421, 6100610
- 6110175, 6110180, 6110400, 6110430,
- 6120070, 6120400, 6120430, 6120450, 6120500, 6120850, 6120920, 6120930, 6120936
- 9576000, 9576240, 9576265, 9576266, 9576268, 9576300, 9576320, 9576324

**Being on a National Forest System trail. 36 CFR 261.55 (a).** For the purpose of this order, all methods of travel and use are prohibited on the following National Forest System trails:

- Kettle Crest Trail #13 North – from its intersection with Old Stage Trail #1 north to its terminus on County Road 602
- Ryan Cabin Trail #30
- Big Lick Trail #30.1
- Profanity Trail #32
- Deer Creek Summit North Trail #40
- Midnight Ridge Trail #41
- Deer Creek Summit South Trail #43
- Long Alec Trail #43.1
- Lambert Trail #47
- Leona Trail #49
- Leona Loop Trail #49.1
- Stickpin Trail #71
- Taylor Ridge Trail #74 from the Kettle Crest Trail #13 North east to its intersection with Forest Road 6113000 (Bulldog Cabin Road)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Owners or lessees of land in the area affected by the closure, to the extent necessary to access their land.
3. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

4. Forest Service Contractors, their agents and employees when in performance of official business.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559, 3571, and 3581).
