**ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR
RESTRICTING PUBLIC USE OF A PORTION OF THE CHAMPNEY FALLS
LOOP TRAIL
TO WIT:
WHITE MOUNTAIN NATIONAL FOREST – NEW HAMPSHIRE
SACO RANGER DISTRICT**

Under the authority of the Act of Congress dated June 4, 1897, as amended (16 U.S.C. 551), and pursuant to the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations set forth as 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b)), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the Champney Falls Loop Trail, Located on the White Mountain National Forest, Saco Ranger District, in the Town of Albany, New Hampshire, said area being described and designated as shown on the map set forth at Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereto:

1. It is prohibited to go into or be upon the area posted as closed to public use for the protection of public health and safety. (36 CFR 261.53(e)).

THESE RESTRICTIONS ARE NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND TO PROTECT NATIONAL FOREST PROPERTY. THEY ARE IN ADDITION TO THE GENERAL PROHIBITIONS SET FORTH IN 36 CFR PART 261. THE PROHIBITION WILL BE IN EFFECT FROM THE DATE OF THIS ORDER UNTIL SPECIFICALLY WITHDRAWN BY TERMINATION ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR.

Pursuant to the provisions of 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission (36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)); and,
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty (36 CFR 261.50(e)(4));

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both (16 U.S.C., 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
