



# HISTORIC STRUCTURE PRESERVATION

PROVIDING A SENSE OF PLACE, CONTINUITY, AND IDENTITY

*Section 110 (16 U.S.C. 470h-2) of the National Historic Preservation Act states that the heads of all Federal agencies shall assume responsibility for the preservation of historic properties which are owned or controlled by such agency... each Federal agency shall use, to the maximum extent feasible, historic properties available to the agency:*

*By preserving historic structures on the Sierra National Forest, we are able to share the spaces and environments in which the generations before us lived. The maintaining of these structures provides a visual and tangible link to our shared cultural identity.*








