Occupancy and Use Restrictions  
NFST 1776 – Colorado Trail

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50(b), the following act is prohibited on a portion of National Forest System Trail #1776 which is located on National Forest System lands within the South Platte Ranger District of the Pike National Forest, Douglas and Jefferson Counties, State of Colorado (the "Restricted Trail").

The Restricted Trail is described as approximately 3.25 miles of segment of National Forest System Trail #1776, also known as the Colorado Trail, that is located in Waterton Canyon. This portion of the Colorado Trail is located in the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, T7S, R69W, E ½ of Section 5, NE ¼ of Section 8, W ½ of Section 9, W ½ of Section 16, and the E ½ of Section 17. The Restricted Trail is shown on the attached map, which is hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

This Order is necessary to provide for public health and safety.

**PROHIBITION:**

- 1. Being on the Restricted Trail except during daytime hours beginning one half hour before sunrise and ending one half hour after sunset on Saturdays and Sundays . 36 C.F.R. 261.55 (a)

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1) Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 2) Authorized Persons associated with Denver Water – High Line Canal Diversion Structure repairs, while engaged in the performance of their work related duties.
- 3) Persons with a written Forest Service authorization specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.

This Order shall be in effect from September 6, 2016, through December 31, 2016, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.


