

MANAGEMENT AREA C

Desired Condition of Management Area

This Management Area designates National Forest System lands on the Hoosier as communication sites, including location of buildings, towers, access roads, and other ancillary improvements.

Five communications sites currently occur on the Hoosier:

Guidance

Communication site management plans will be prepared for each site. Site management plans will provide site-specific guidance or restrictions regarding site use, maintenance, and future development. Management activities necessary to maintain the function and operations of these sites as intended may take place before final development of site specific management plans, following all appropriate analysis and public involvement, depending on the level of action.

Provide for Human and Community Development

Maximize efficient use of communications sites and facilitate their orderly development and management through identification of the senior use and other compatible users.

Maintain the integrity of public safety, two-way communications while providing opportunities for other types of communications uses.

Provide a safe and high-quality communications environment with minimal user interference.

Mitigate environmental impacts on natural resources; provide for public and occupational safety; and maintain a reasonable level of aesthetic integrity.
