### Snake Fire

Location: 5 mi. SE of Battle Creek Campground, WY

Started: 9/10/16

Cause: Under investigation

Size: 2,560 acres

Containment: 40%

Resources: 192 firefighters, 6 crews, 2 engines, 2 dozers, 2 helicopters

### Broadway Fire

Location: 11 mi. S of Encampment, WY

Started: 8/14/16

Cause: Lightning

Size: 2,120 acres

Containment: 10%

Resources: 33 firefighters, 1 crew, 1 engine, 1 dozer

### Beaver Creek Fire

Location: 24 mi. N of Walden, CO

Started: 6/19/16

Cause: Under investigation

Size: 38,374 acres

Containment: 72%

Resources: 165 firefighters, 1 crew, 10 engines, 1 dozer, 2 helicopters, 2 water tenders

### Snake Fire

Firefighters took advantage of recent cool, rainy weather to make substantial progress in containing the Snake Fire, achieving 40% containment by Friday evening. Today firefighters will continue to protect private structures and utility infrastructure, and take appropriate actions to minimize fire spread to the south and west.

### Broadway Fire

Logs continue to be hauled away from Road 496, where roadside tree cutting created a defensive line on the west side of the Broadway Fire. Fire personnel will continue monitoring the fire area to detect and respond to spot fires. Today, the Broadway Fire spike camp will be dismantled. All personnel working on this fire will now be supported at the Incident Command Post west of Cowdrey, Colorado.

### Beaver Creek Fire

Fire behavior was very low on Friday, but firefighters continue to monitor the northwest and southwest perimeter of the Beaver Creek Fire, and patrol Road 408 to detect spot fires that might cross it. Fire personnel continue to remove equipment from the fire area, and make repairs needed after suppression efforts.

### Fire Conditions and Weather

Friday's cold, calm weather moderated the activity of all three fires. Starting Saturday, fire behavior is expected to gradually increase as weather conditions become warmer, drier, and windier, with no chance of precipitation.

### Closures and Restrictions

Fire Area Closures on National Forest System Lands and BLM-managed land remains in effect and can be viewed on the InciWeb page for each fire.

A temporary flight restriction (TFR) is in effect over the Broadway, Beaver Creek and Snake Fires, and includes the Hog Park Reservoir. Boaters planning to use Hog Park Reservoir should note that the east side is closed due to helicopters dipping water.
