***TEMPORARY AREA CLOSURE***

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and Title 36 CFR 261.50(a) the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this Order, and depicted on the attached map which is hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A, all within the Santa Catalina Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Pima County, Arizona:

**PROHIBITIONS:**

- 1. Discharging a firearm, air rifle paint ball gun, or gas gun between the western boundary of the Coronado National Forest and mile marker 6.3 along Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Rd, or within 0.6 miles of that segment of the road. 36 CFR 261.58(m)**
- 2. Parking a motorized vehicle between mile markers 5.8 and 6.3 along Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Rd. 36 CFR 261.58(g)**

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

**AREA DESCRIBED:**

**The restricted area is the segment of Forest Road 371, also known as E. Redington Rd, from the western boundary of the Coronado National Forest to mile marker 6.3. This area is located at T13S, R17E, S 30, 31, 36 Gila and Salt River Meridian (As shown on the attached map).**

**PURPOSE:**

The purpose of the temporary area closure is for the following:

- To assure the protection of public health and safety by prohibiting the discharge of firearms, air rifles, gas guns, and paintball guns within the designated area.
- To continue to allow for rehabilitation of informal shooting areas remediated in October 2014 under a CERCLA Time Critical Removal Action.


NOTICE

Regulations codified at 36 CFR 261.10(d) generally prohibit discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property, including archery equipment, within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or across or on a NFS road or in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result in such discharge. The purpose of this Order is to add additional restrictions on the discharge of firearms within the designated area to protect public health and safety.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order shall be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 30, 2018 or until it is rescinded, whichever is earlier.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].
