MAJOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Forest Engineer provides program leadership and strategic guidance for the forest-wide Engineering program.

Program manager duties include development of the programs of work and workplans for Engineering/minerals administration and input to the regional zone Lands program. Annual budgets for these programs are in the \$1.0 to \$2.0 million range.

Participates with the Forest Supervisor and the Forest Management Team in the formulation of Forest policies, objectives, work programs, and plans by providing authoritative input on Engineering activities of the National Forest including (1) the Forest transportation system of roads, trails, that will serve the resource needs on Federal lands; (2) restoration and rehabilitation activities are an integral part the Forest Engineering position. As part of the integrated watershed restoration team the Forest Engineer works with partners and all forest specialists to plan and implement watershed restoration projects, and transportation system remediation and decommissioning; (3) construction and maintenance of Forest improvements that include administrative buildings, dwellings, warehouses, garages, bridges, lookouts, water systems, sewer systems, and treatment facilities; (4) cadastral and photogrammetric engineering; (5) fleet equipment and (6) administering a complex land adjustment program in a rapidly growing wild land/urban interface area.

Implements and executes the project plans for the engineering and minerals program area. Responsible for the quality, quantity, and coordination of all work performed in the assigned program areas on the forest. Directs the activities of subordinate programs to ensure Forest plan requirements and goals are accomplished. Maintains awareness of new

technological develops in the program areas. Oversees study projects to develop guidelines, standards, and procedures for analyzing public needs, demands.

Partnerships are an essential to the forest. Opportunities to work with community partners in the Engineering program and other resource program areas is key to accomplishing work on the Prescott NF. The incumbent should have excellent communication skills and a willingness to build new partnership opportunities.

Please note: field work is a component of the job and includes hiking in steep, rugged terrain, riding or driving a UTV and coping with weather and various job hazards.

APPLYING FOR THIS POSITION: This position will be advertised through USAJobs, www.usajobs.opm.gov, with a duty station of Prescott, Arizona. It is a GS-12 permanent, full time position. Relocation expenses may be authorized. Position should be on USAJobs within the next 90 days.

DUTY STATION FOREST: The Prescott NF lies in west Central Arizona. At the lowest elevation, the landscape is dominated by the lower Sonoran desert ecosystem. As the land gains elevation, chaparral and desert grassland becomes common, followed by pinon-pine and juniper. Above that, Ponderosa Pine is the dominant ecosystem. Elevation on the Forest ranges from about 3,000 - 7,600 feet.



The forest focus is on integrated restoration, partnerships, sustainable recreation and intergration of resource areas. The Forest plan of work is forest wide and employees work forest-wide across district boundaries. At this time there are four staff Areas (Natural Resources; Fire & Fuels; Administrative and Engineering, Lands, Minerals, & Recreation) and three districts. As our workforce organization continues to change this along w/regional zoning of the Lands program this position may take on additional supervisory and management duties of the minerals program area.

PRESCOTT AREA COMMUNITY



Prescott Arizona is situated in the beautiful Northern Arizona Mountains surrounded by the Prescott National Forest. Prescott's slogan is "everybody's hometown", which describes the welcoming and inviting appeal that makes it such a wonderful place to live. Conveniently located just 100 miles north of Phoenix, 66 miles from Sedona and 96 miles from the cool pines of Flagstaff; Prescott is centrally located to all that Arizona has to offer.

The weather in Prescott is hard to beat; offering all 4 seasons, with sunny spring-time weather, warm summers, gorgeous fall colors and seasonably cool winters. Rich with history that includes mining, cowboys and outlaws, and the world's oldest rodeo; there is something for everyone in Prescott. From golfing, exploring nature, hiking, camping, hunting, fishing, exploring the back roads of Arizona, mining, live concerts on the plaza, museums, great restaurants, local art, to learning about Arizona's history. Prescott offers that small town feeling with city amenities and entertainment.

Prescott, Prescott Valley, Chino Valley, Arizona

Located in central Arizona, the Prescott Tri-City Area is a full-service community with small town character. The Prescott area is the marketing and cultural center of north central Arizona. Today visitors and new residents come from everywhere to enjoy the area's mild climate, natural beauty, and historical and cultural points of interest.

POPULATION: About 50,000 in Prescott, 50,000 in Prescott Valley, and 10,000 in Chino Valley.

ELEVATION: 5,300 (mile high)

CLIMATE: The Prescott area has a fairly arid and moderate climate; annual rainfall is about 18 inches and annual snowfall averages from 6-12 inches; snow is most likely during late winter and early spring.

SCHOOLS: Prescott, Prescott Valley, and Chino Valley each have one public high school. Elementary and middle schools are abundant. Private and charter schools exist for all grade levels. Yavapai College, a two-year community college, has campuses in all three communities. Prescott College, a private college, and the renowned Embry Riddle

Aeronautical University are located in Prescott. Northern Arizona University, based in Flagstaff, also conducts classes in Prescott.

MEDICAL FACILITIES: The Yavapai Regional Medical Center and Department of Veteran's Affairs Medical Center are located in Prescott. The East campus of the Yavapai Regional Medical Center is located in Prescott Valley. Numerous clinics exist and a full array of medical services is available.

SHOPPING: A full array of shopping services exists in the Prescott Tri-City area.

MAJOR EMPLOYERS: Community, county, state, federal, school districts and colleges are the major employers. Construction, service industries, and tourism are the major private employment sources.

HOUSING: Rentals may be available in the area. Housing prices range from approximately \$200,000 - \$300,000 in Prescott Valley and Chino Valley. Prescott averages about \$300,000 and up.
