

**FOREST ORDER**

**USDA FOREST SERVICE  
SAN JUAN NATIONAL FOREST  
Mancos-Dolores Ranger District**

**McPhee Overlook Trail #155 - Seasonal Trail Use Restrictions**

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System Lands on the Mancos-Dolores Ranger District of the San Juan National Forest, Montezuma County, State of Colorado upon the MCPhee Overlook Trail #155 as depicted of the attached map hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

This order is necessary protect critical winter wildlife habitat.

**PROHIBITIONS:**

- 1) Being on the MCPhee Overlook Trail #155 from the Forest Service boundary fence (T.37N, R.15 W, Section 9) to May Canyon (T.37N, R.15 W, Section 8) annually between December 1<sup>st</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup> [36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a)].
- 2) Being on the MCPhee Overlook Trail #155 from May Canyon (T.37N, R.15 W, Section 8) to the House Creek Campground (T.38N, R.15 W, Section 32) annually between December 1<sup>st</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup> [36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a)].

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1) Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2) Any Federal, State, or local law enforcement officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force engaged in the performance of an official duty.

This Order shall remain in effect until October 28, 2019, or until rescinded, whichever occurs first.
