Summary (Purpose): A routed system of trails within or in close proximity to the Bitterroot National Forest, for which the BNF has administrative responsibility (June, 2016).

Description (Abstract): A trail is a linear feature constructed for the purpose of allowing the free movement of people, stock, or Off Highway Vehicles (OHV).

Attributes:

ID: Trail number.

NAME: Name of the trail.

BMP: Beginning measure point of the route.

EMP: Ending measure point of the route.

SEG_LENGTH: Length of the trail segment, in miles.

BEGIN_TERM: Beginning location of the trail segment.

END_TERMIN: Ending location of the trail segment.

DESIGNED_U: Use for which the trail was designed:

Value: ATV – ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE

Value: HIKE – HIKER/PEDESTRIAN

Value: MTRCYCL – MOTORCYCLE

Value: PACK – PACK AND SADDLE
