The atlatl is very significant as it represents a tremendous leap in human technology and thinking. The atlatl is the ancient ancestor of all modern propulsion technologies. Participants will have an opportunity to test their skills with the Atlatl.


Kid's Day! Birds of Prey – July 18th; 1 p.m.
